Harvest	Early March
Mass	150g
Shape	Flat globose
Skin colour	Red striped/blush over yellow background
Lenticels	Conspicuous
Flesh colour	Cream
Taste	Juicy, sweet
Texture	Crisp
Storage ability	Very good

Mature fruit susceptible to water core. Fruit picked with green background do not become yellow with cold storage.
