# Tree

<b>Chilling</b>	Medium to high
<b>Vigour</b>	Weak to moderate
<b>Growth habit</b>	Spreading
<b>Full bloom</b>	End September, early October
<b>Pollinators</b>	Golden Delicious, Hillieri, Gala
<b>Bearing habit</b>	Spurs and shoots
<b>Production</b>	Very good



# Fruit

<b>Harvest</b>	Late March (dependant on area)
<b>Mass</b>	180g
<b>Shape</b>	Globose
<b>Skin colour</b>	Heavy red stripe on red over a cream background, blushed appearance on some fruit
<b>Lenticels</b>	Conspicuous
<b>Flesh colour</b>	White
<b>Taste</b>	Fragrant, less acid than standard Braeburn
<b>Texture</b>	Firm and juicy
<b>Storage ability</b>	Good

Thinning recommended otherwise variety might over crop. Definitely better colour than standard Braeburn, with less acid. Tighter harvest window. Bitterpit control essential. Honeycore occurs in ripe fruit.
