Vigour	Strong in young trees, settles well into consistent fruiting
Growth habit	Upright
Full bloom	Early October
Pollinators	Golden Delicious, Hillieri, Gala
Bearing habit	Spurs and shoots
Production	High

Harvest	Late March
Mass	140g
Shape	Globose to flat-globose
Skin colour	Block red and in poorer colouring areas red stripe over a green-yellow background
Lenticels	Conspicuous
Flesh colour	Cream
Taste	Sweet and tangy
Texture	Crisp
Storage ability	Good from regular air storage and excellent in CA

Bitterpit control essential. Honey core occurs in ripe fruit.
